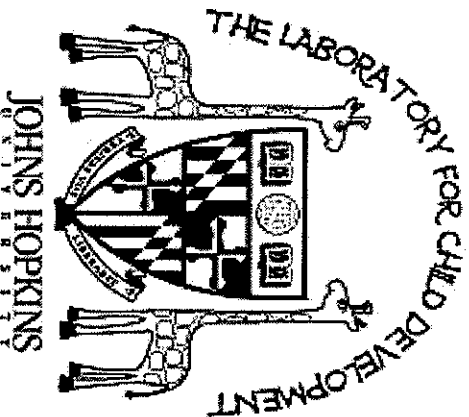

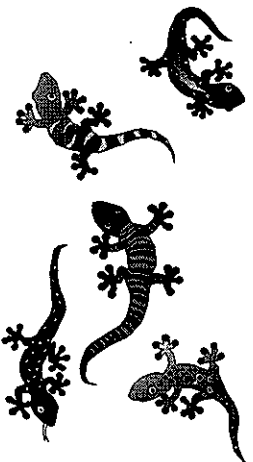

- Your child will receive a small thank-you gift for participating.

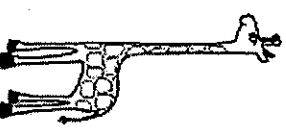
